	1 Corinthians 1:31 Therefore, as it is written: "Let him who boasts boast in the Lord."
	2 Corinthians 10:17 But, "Let him who boasts boast in the Lord." ¹⁸ For it is not the one who commends himself who is approved, but the one whom the Lord commends.
Q21	2 Corinthians 12:6 [Paul continues his discussion on 'personal' boasting.] Even if I should choose to boast, I would not be a fool, because would be speaking the truth. But I refrain, so no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say. [Actions speak louder than words!] ⁷ To keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassingly great revelations, there wa given me a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹ But He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. ¹⁰ That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong. If someone "boasts," what does it say about their character?

✓ In Genesis 1:26, God gave Adam (humankind) the responsibility to "rule... over all the earth".

Genesis 1:26

Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, in our likeness, and let them <u>rule</u> over the fish of the sea and the birds of the air, over the livestock, over all the earth, and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

- After the fall of man (when Eve and Adam ate from the forbidden 'tree of the knowledge of good and evil'), the "rule... over all the earth" passed to Satan.
- Jesus confirmed this statement during the second of His three temptations when He did <u>not</u> refute Satan's claim of ownership. In **Luke 4:5-8** we read, "The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. ⁶ And he said to him, 'I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. ⁷ So if you worship me, it will all be yours.' ⁸ Jesus answered, 'It is written: Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'"

¹⁷ But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ Peacemakers who sow in peace raise a harvest of righteousness.
