² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them.

¹⁵ "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶ And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another <u>Helper</u>, to be with you forever, ¹⁷ even the <u>Spirit of truth</u>, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he <u>dwells with you and will be in you</u>. [English Standard Version (ESV)]

John 16:13-14 [Jesus taught]

But when he, the <u>Spirit of truth</u>, comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. ¹⁴ He will bring glory to me by taking from what is mine and making it known to you.

Romans 8:26-27

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¹³ This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, expressing spiritual truths in spiritual words.
