And I'm giving you and your descendants this land where you're now just camping, this whole country of Canaan, to own forever. And I'll be their God."

Genesis 17:9-14 [NIV-1984]

In the Pentateuch (the 1st five books in the Old Testament) there are many references to God's "Covenant" (or promise). With each new reference to "Covenant", God progressively elaborates on past covenants by either making it clearer or more expansive. In the English Standard Version, there are 41 references to "Covenant" within the pages of Genesis and Exodus.

Lesson 8: 1 Corinthians 7:17-40

Hebrews 8:6-13 [The Message]

But Jesus' priestly work far surpasses what these other priests do, since he's working from a far better plan. If the first plan — the old <u>covenant</u> — had worked out, a second wouldn't have been needed. But we know the first was found wanting, because God said, Heads up! The days are coming when I'll set up a new plan for dealing with Israel and Judah. I'll throw out the old plan I set up with their ancestors when I led them by the hand out of Egypt. They didn't keep their part of the bargain, so I looked away and let it go. This new plan I'm making with Israel isn't going to be written on paper, isn't going to be chiseled in stone; This time I'm writing out the plan in them, carving it on the lining of their hearts. I'll be their God, they'll be my people. They won't go to school to learn about me, or buy a book called God in Five Easy Lessons. They'll all get to know me firsthand, the little and the big, the small and the great. They'll get to know me by being kindly forgiven, with the slate of their sins forever wiped clean. By coming up with a new plan, a new <u>covenant</u> between God and his people, God put the old plan on the shelf. And there it stays, gathering dust.
